


# Drag-N-Scale

## User's Guide



Drag-N-Scale allows you to resize images visually. Simply resize the window to resize the displayed image.

### The Toolbar:



The Picture Folder Icon: click to open a folder of images in Drag-N-Scale

The iMedia Browser Icon: click to open iMedia Browser (if available in your Applications folder). iMedia Browser is free to download from the [iTunes App Store](#).

The Number Icon: click to add sequential numbering to image names

The Mail Icon: click to email resized images using Apple's Mail

The Hard Drive Icon: click to save resized images

### **Adding Images to Drag-N-Scale**

There are several ways to add images to Drag-N-Scale:

1. Drop a folder containing images on the Drag-N-Scale icon
2. Drop a folder containing images on the Drag-N-Scale Image list area
3. Click the Pictures Folder icon to add a folder of images
4. Click the “+” button under the image list to add individual images
5. Drag image, albums, or events from iMedia Browser to the image list area
6. Drag and drop individual image files or groups of image files onto the image list area
7. Drag an individual image file onto the Drag-N-Scale icon

### **Resizing Images**

To resize the displayed image resize the Drag-N-Scale window. The image resizes as you resize the window. The image size is displayed at the bottom right of the image in the display area.

### **Emailing Resized Images**

Resize the displayed image to the desired size

Select one or more images in the Image list.

Click the Mail icon.

### **Saving Resized Images**

Resize the displayed image to the desired size

Select one or more images in the Images list

Click the Hard Drive icon.

### **Dragging Resized Images**

You can drag resized images from the display area to your desktop, a folder, or another application.

### **Renaming Image Files**

If you edit the text in the File Name field the corresponding file's name will reflect that change.

### **Numbering Images**

To number the images listed in the Images list click the Number icon. Enter a base name, the starting number, and the file extension. If you want the numbering to precede the base name click the checkbox.

Click the OK button.
